Background Nunavut's population according to the 2006 Census was **29,474**, an increase

of 10.2% from 2001 Census; during this period Canada's population increased by 5.4%. According to the 2006 Census there were 9,041 private

dwellings in Nunavut.

E: Care should be exercised in comparing the Northwest Territories 2006 Census population counts with counts from the 2001 Census. In 2001, the net undercount for the Northwest Territories was estimated at 8.11%, substantially higher than the national level of 2.99%, and almost double its 1996 level. The increase in the population between 2001 and 2006 is likely overstated due to improvements in coverage of the Northwest Territories in 2006.

Background

Most communities in Nunavut saw an increase in their population counts from the 2001 Census to the 2006 Census. Repulse Bay, Igloolik and Iqaluit showed the strongest population growth during that period.

With a population of 6,184 according to the 2006 Census, Iqaluit remains the most populous community in the territory, accounting for about 21% of Nunavut's total population. Rankin Inlet and Arviat were the second and third largest communities in terms of population, with more than 2,000 residents.

The population decrease from 2001 to 2006 Censuses were observed in the smaller communities of Grise Fiord, Qikiqtarjuaq, Kimmirut and Chesterfield Inlet.
