Topic Nunavut Community Population Counts

2006 and 2011 Censuses

Released by Statistics Canada, February 8, 2012

Background

Most communities in Nunavut saw an increase in population counts from the 2006 Census to the 2011 Census. Repulse Bay, Gjoa Haven and Arctic Bay showed the strongest population growth during that period.

With a population of **6,699** according to the 2011 Census, Iqaluit remains the most populous community in the territory, accounting for about **21%** of Nunavut's total population. Arviat and Rankin Inlet were the second and third largest communities in terms of population, with more than **2,000** residents.

Population counts decreased from 2006 to 2011 in the communities of Hall Beach, Grise Fiord, Resolute, Chesterfield Inlet, Igloolik and Rankin Inlet.
