



What if I am away on duty or medical travel while both vaccine clinics are happening in my community?

Please call your health centre when you return. You will be placed on a wait list and your appointment will be confirmed once additional clinic dates are announced.

What if I am in the community for the first dose clinic on duty or medical travel but away during the second dose clinic, should I take the vaccine?

The second dose is given on average 28 days after the first one. Please call you health centre. They will be able to best advise on a course of action. Remember, all Nunavummiut who want the vaccine will be able to receive it.

Can I get the vaccine in another community other than the one I live in?

We ask that individuals receive the vaccine where they reside. We know however that this isn't always possible and encourage individuals to call their local health centre to discuss options.

Can Nunavut arrange for Nunavummiut who currently live in other jurisdictions to be vaccinated?

Nunavummiut who currently reside in other jurisdictions should follow the vaccination schedule of the province or territory they reside in.

Can people who don't live in Nunavut get the vaccine while they are here for work?

The COVID-19 vaccine is administered to Nunavut residents, nurses, physicians, midwives, RCMP, EMS and fire fighters.

Please bring the following ID information to your appointment:

Nunavut Residents:

- Must be in the same community for both doses.
- Please bring your Nunavut health card or other valid ID (i.e. passport, drivers license, etc.) demonstrating residency at time of your appointment.
- Other applicable forms of ID: NTI enrollment cards, hunting licences, and documents such as rental agreements and QEC bills as proof of residency.
