**Topic:** **Consumer Price Index (2002=100.0)**  
 September 2021  
 Released by Statistics Canada – October 20, 2021

**Background:** In September 2021, consumers in Iqaluit paid **2.6%** more than in September 2020 for the goods and services included in the Consumer Price Index basket.

The Canadian Consumer Price Index increased by **4.4%** over the same period.
