Background According to the 2011 Census, the median age in Nunavut was **24.1** years, which is

the lowest in the country. The territory had the highest proportion of children aged 14 and under at **32.7%** and the lowest proportion of people aged 65 and over at **3.3%**.

The proportion of people aged 65 and over increased between 2006 and 2011 for most provinces and territories, while the percentage of children aged 14 and under

declined.
