Nunavut Property Tax

Senior Citizens and People with Disabilities Property Tax Relief (SCPDPTR) Application

The Senior Citizens and Disabled Person's Property Tax Relief Act (SCDPPTRA) makes seniors and the people with disabilities eligible for property tax relief equivalent to their current-year levy, provided they both own (in whole or in part) their home and live in it for at least 184 days per year.

Please note that an application to the SCPDPTR program is required <u>every year</u> that you wish to receive relief. This is to ensure a homeowner's continued eligibility. Also, note that if you have an outstanding balance of tax levies accumulated prior to eligibility to the program, including interest charges, these are still owed to the government.

To qualify for relief, an applicant must complete this form and submit any required documentation. Failure to do so means a homeowner is ineligible for the program.

The Department of Finance may keep these documents for a minimum of seven years, for both audit and re-application purposes.
