**Background:** In Nunavut, labour productivity for the business sector **increased** by **7.7%** 

in 2018 and the real GDP of businesses increased by 15.9%.

## Notes:

- 1. Calculations of productivity growth rates are based on numbers rounded to one decimal.
- This release incorporates an update to 2018 data on provincial and territorial labour productivity and related variables in the business sector by industry.
  - These data are consistent with those incorporated in the provincial and territorial gross domestic product by industry for 2018, released on May 1, 2019. No revisions have been made to data for previous years. Revised estimates of hours worked and labour productivity in the provinces and territories for 2016 to 2018 will be published in February 2020.
- 3. Readers should be aware that the percentage figure changes for Nunavut can vary significantly due to the relatively small numbers. Taken over longer periods of time, the resulting changes would likely be more reflective of the actual changes in either labour productivity or hours worked.
