Topic: Police-Reported Violent Crimes, 2011
Released by Statistics Canada February 25, 2013

Background: In 2011, the number of police-reported victims of violent crime in Nunavut was **2,729**. As is the case with violent crime overall, the territories have consistently recorded the highest rates of police-reported violence against women. The rate of violent crime against women in Nunavut (**15,453** per 100,000 females) was nearly **13** times higher than the rate for Canada.
