## Nine new cases of COVID-19 in Nunavut

**Iqaluit, Nunavut (December 14, 2020)** – Today, Nunavut has a total of 49 active cases of COVID-19 and a total of 207 recovered cases. Nine new cases have been identified in Arviat, bringing the community's number of active cases to 49.

Contact tracing in all impacted communities is ongoing and public health staff are monitoring everyone in isolation. As of December 13, Arviat testing has yielded 899 negative tests. Monitoring in Sanikiluaq, Rankin Inlet and Whale Cove continues.

Anyone who has reason to believe they have been exposed to COVID-19 is advised to call the COVID-hotline at 1-888-975-8601 between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. EST, or notify their community health centre right away, and immediately isolate at home for 14 days. Please do not go to the health centre in person.
